*If the test returns positive, parents / guardians within the bubble will be notified of the day the symptoms appeared.
*Close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace and out-of-school settings will not be expected to undertake contact tracing. As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case to identify close contacts.
*If a family member who lives in the household has a confirmed case of Covid-19, the child needs to selfisolate as directed by NHS Test & trace and get tested if they develop symptoms.

STEPPING MEASURES UP & DOWN (KICK Outbreak Management Plan)

KICK have an Outbreak Management Plan outlining how KICK Camps operate if there is an outbreak in the setting or local area.

KICK Camps adhere to the following Control Measures:

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes, using standard products such as detergents
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19

1-2	NO ACTION – No further action but ensure controls are maintained and reviewed
